FROM A SERMON ON MAY 7

PRACTICING YOUR SERVE

This spring we looked at what it would mean to follow Christ to the Cross and what it would mean in our lives to take up and "Bear the Cross" daily. Tim challenged us in his May 7 message, *The Cost of Discipleship*, to practice our "serve," saying "we must put our self-interests aside daily - not once in a while, monthly or when convenient to us - but daily." This may seem overwhelming, but for myself, the more I serve others, the more I realize what a blessed life I do have because of Jesus! I cannot even imagine how one gets through the challenges life presents without the comfort of walking daily with Christ.

This spring we challenged our small groups to practice their "serve" and come up with a service project to reach out to our community. Groups were challenged by this and also discovered that to serve well does not always mean "quick and easy." To spread the Gospel means spending time getting to know others, investing ourselves in them and their lives, and becoming involved with organizations that serve their needs . . . none of which can be done in the span of a 5-minute service project! That said, some groups were able to complete their "mission," while others have discovered that it will take some additional time to accomplish what they feel God has tasked their group to do to reach others for Christ.

If you were not in Sunday's service on June 18, during which some groups shared testimonies from their service, I encourage you to watch the recorded service. It was powerful to once again witness how much we are encouraged, our faith is strengthened, and how truly blessed we are personally when we reach out with the intention to serve others!

We concluded our time of testimonies with a prayer that we will continue to:

- Find ways to stay connected with each other throughout the summer months.
- Serve our neighborhoods and be a witness to those around us.
- And most importantly, LISTEN to people's stories as a way to engage with them and hopefully point them to a God of Love who cares deeply enough for them that He sent His only Son for them.

SESSION FORMAT

t the May presbytery meeting and at the national gathering of presbytery moderators, ECO leadership encouraged Sessions and Presbyteries to try a different model for meetings, in order to shift our work from the "boardroom" to the "upper room." At its June meeting, Session used the new model. By getting reports out earlier and using a consent agenda (one vote to approve all routine or noncontroversial items for action), the business portion of the meeting took only 30 minutes. That left the remaining time to focus on two essential parts of being

- Worship, Scripture, Message/Teaching, Prayer
- Visioning, Training/Equipping, Mission

the spiritual leaders of this congregation:

For the Visioning and Equipping portion of the meeting, the Session worked through the 2nd session of *Becoming a Flourishing Church*. This requires each of us to make a 2-4 month plan to work on an area of personal spiritual growth, because "flourishing disciples become flourishing leaders who build a flourishing church."




Mrs. Alisha Finn enriched the three-year-olds' Music Week by sharing and playing a collection of instruments.

BRENDA REIBSON

I once read a book on raising children that referred to "God's upside down world." It suggested asking your kids, "Who wants to be last?" to help them understand God's reversal of individualistic values.

Whatever you think of that approach, let's look back for a minute to Jesus' time here on earth. When Jesus began teaching the disciples about God's kingdom, they were shocked at what they heard because it was the opposite of what they were expecting. They thought Jesus was going to be a conquering hero who would rescue them from religious and political oppression. Instead, Jesus said things like "the last shall be first and the first shall be last" and that whoever wanted to become great must be a servant. It was all reversed!

A memorable event took place not long before Jesus was taken away to be crucified. He gave the disciples an object lesson by wrapping a towel around his waist and kneeling down to wash their feet. Then, He told them, "Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you." (John 13:14-15)

Jesus told them, and us, point blank, that we are to serve. But look at that last phrase, "as I have done for you." The disciples didn't fully understand all that Jesus was about to do for them. Even with hindsight, we struggle to grasp the incredible fact that Jesus' sacrifice covers all our sin. We can never do as Jesus has done for us!

But here's an amazing part of the reversal that Jesus lived out in his life, death, and resurrection: even though our human efforts can never begin to compare to what Jesus has done, He values our humble service to others. Not only is our service valued, but God cares enough about us to give us meaningful service to perform.

Ponder these truths as you continue to determine your unique S.H.A.P.E. for ministry and to seek your fit in the body of Christ.
