The Sermon on the Mount is more than a set of rules. It is a call to embody Kingdom virtues and priorities that are not easy to live by. It is a call to the good life- but not good in the way the world defines "good." It paints the profile of flourishing disciples who pursue the Kingdom values Jesus taught. And therefore, it describes those who are "blessed."

Join us this fall as we study the first section of the Sermon on the Mount- the Beatitudes- found in Matthew 5. Small groups are also encouraged to dig deeper and challenge one another to FLOURISH!

#### RESTORING OUR JOY AND FLOURISHING

Tim's sermon on Psalms of Community Lament resonated with me. He asked, "Have you ever felt far & distant from God, lament lacking the joy of when you first came to Christ?" I don't feel like I am lacking joy but I do feel at times that I am not as passionate and desiring to grow my faith as I should be. A recent experience has had me thinking about this: I was particularly touched when one of our newest covenant partners was so excited to be joining the church that she posted a picture of her membership certificate and the quote, "Every hour I need You," from the song *Lord, I Need You* (Matt Maher) that we sang that morning. I have to ask myself, "when was the last time I was so excited about my faith that I wanted to share with the world and recognized that 'every hour I do need You?" In other words, am I flourishing as a disciple?

This year we will be examining what is means to be a flourishing disciple (see pastor's page this month). I ran across an article discussing an in-depth study, *The Discipleship Assessment*, done by LifeWay Research that examined the state of discipleship in the church today. They netted out "eight attributes that consistently show up in the lives of maturing disciples: bible engagement; obeying God and denying self; serving God and others; sharing Christ; exercising faith; seeking God; building relationships; and being unashamed (transparency). The study also found that certain kinds of behavior led to people growing in those attributes. Among them: confessing our sins and reading the Bible.

Why do I share this? Because I have found that for myself, I need my small group to help me keep on track with devotions (reading my Bible) and being authentic (confessing my sins). It is way too easy to get sucked into our American culture of busyness (pushing out time with God). It is also way too easy to become self-absorbed and not recognize the sin in my life.

If you are not actively in a small group, I invite you to take a step out of your comfort zone, connect with others, and pursue becoming a "flourishing" disciple with others here at FPC:Endicott! Watch for new small group opportunities this fall or speak directly with me about potentially joining a group or starting your own small group/micro-group. Together as *Flourishing Disciples* we will become a *Flourishing Church*!

# DON'T SETTLE

Over the course of twelve years at First Presbyterian Church: Endicott, I've had the privilege of teaching the Bible, sharing the Gospel with kids, crying with students as they struggled in relationships praying with older students as they tried to figure out college and career plans, traveling with team members for conferences and mission trips, working alongside kids of all ages at work camps, retreats, Bible studies, and investing in training in childcare and babysitting helpers. It has brought me great joy to have built amazing relationships as God has brought young and old across my path with eagerness to be discipled.

#### Don't settle for church attendance as your expression of faith.

Let God's truth transform your mind and change you so much that you can't be mistaken for anything other than a follower of Christ 24/7.

#### Don't settle for finding your value in comparison to others.

Know that you are created in the image of God. You are fearfully and wonderfully made. God gave your life purpose before you were born. Live into that truth.

#### Don't settle for chasing the priorities our culture praises.

Money, fame, titles, promotions, and beauty are all temporary. They will fade away. Put your energy into knowing God and sharing the Gospel with others.

#### Don't settle for calling yourself a Christian without being a Christ-follower.


A title is empty unless you are living into it. Live into the amazing truth that Jesus has paid for your sin and has called you to unashamedly follow Him.

#### Don't settle for calling kids "future leaders" or the "church of tomorrow."

## Exciting things are happening as Endicott leaders and residents pour time, energy, and resources into revitalizing our community!

Governor Cuomo awarded the URI (Upstate Revitalization Initiative) funding of 20 million dollars to be shared among the three iDistricts: Endicott, Johnson City, and Binghamton.

Laurene Jobs, widow of the late Steve Jobs (co-founder and CEO of Apple, Inc.) came to Endicott this spring to announce to U-E officials that the HQ Institute would present a 2.5 million dollar grant to support the "Tiger Ventures" Initiative housed at the Linneaus W. West School. The community celebrated in July when the school received the grant for this alternative high school and business incubator project, which combines elements of a traditional high school with a technology-infused curriculum.

Note: In the early 2000's, the graduation rate at U-E was about 65%. Today it has grown to 90%. The Tiger Venture Initiative is part of an innovative plan to continue to improve this statistic.

The Downtown Endicott Business Association (DEBA) organized outdoor concerts on the Ave. this summer.

The Endicott Police Department purchased four surveillance cameras and software, and has begun using the equipment to improve safety and security in our community. This technology was made possible by a \$33,000 gift from FPC:E.

Endicott was one of two communities in the finals for a \$10 million dollar grant to revitalize downtown Endicott. The proposal included improving the facades on the Ave., a hotel, green space, etc. Although Endicott did not win this year, there are already plans for an updated submission for next year's contest.

A grant is being sought to expand the Chugnut Trail, which currently runs along the river behind the H.S. and Boys & Girls Club.

The Huron Campus is doing renovations and welcoming start-up businesses.

The Beautification Committee is developing plans to create a Storybook Garden in Endicott for children and families.


New little faces will soon be adorning our school as we kick off 2017-18!

# ALL HANDS ON DECK!

All hands on deck! This call, for all members of a ship's crew to report immediately for work, is a fitting expression for the church today. We've previously focused on the differences that believers have in gifts and the service God has wired and prepared them to do. Here we consider the need for everyone "on board the ship" to answer the call to service.

In 2 Corinthians 3:18, we read of the transformation into the image of God that he works in all believers:

"And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit."

I Corinthians 12, we see the unity from which spiritual gifts originate:

Verse 6b "the same God works all of them in all men."

Verses 24b-26 "God has combined the members of the body and has given greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be *no division* in the body, but that its

parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it."

Verse 27 "Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it."

What's the point? Just as a sports team needs every player to be in top shape in order to perform well, we need to ensure that no one is "left out of the game" in our church. We are transforming into God's image at different rates, but we are all in it together! As we discover and develop our giftedness in God's timing as He grows us to look more like Jesus, let's support and encourage each other along the way. Our "team" will then "perform well" as we reflect the unity of the Spirit that God intends for his people.
