

FLOURISHING DISCIPLES

As we continue to learn and grow together in Christ, we see more and more flourishing take hold in our congregation. One way we flourish is when we make it simple and easy for people to make initial connections with us, and then move on to finding both a meaningful place of service and a smaller community within the congregation in a small group.

Involvement in service and small groups does not automatically ensure spiritual growth and flourishing. However, these points of attachment do provide the framework that allows disciples to grow and flourish, as they serve, worship, learn, pray, and spend time together. Believers were never meant to "go it alone." Jesus both taught and modeled self-giving care of others, together with fellow believers, as a path to identifying more closely with Him and becoming more like Him.

A few like-minded folks have been working together to develop a system for helping people to move from first-time visitors to fully-engaged covenant partners. You may wonder how the development of a system fits in with the organic process of flourishing. Without a system, people are welcomed and assimilated into the community in a hit-or-miss manner. With a system, each person who begins to attend our church receives the attention and follow-through that will help them to grow closer to the church and to Jesus.

Flourishing disciples make disciples.

This is not an endeavor for just a few people. We all need to be aware of those whom God might be nudging us to welcome, to get to know, to invite to serve or visit a small group with us. We can all be part of helping someone to become a flourishing disciple.

Welcoming

Welcoming is the important task of offering an easy connecting point and first impression to those who are visiting our community of faith.

Servant-making

Involvement in servant-making is for those who have a desire to help others discover the ministry God has for them.

Small Groups

People today are longing and searching for community. In an increasingly disconnected society, we have found small groups to be a powerful and effective way to connect and grow in one's faith.

Opportunities:

Greeter – In sanctuary or at outside doors *Guest connector/floater* – Intentionally sees that visitors connect with someone during their visit

Opportunities:

Discovery class facilitator – leading larger groups through the material to discern gifts *Ministry consultant* - one-on-one meetings

Opportunities:

Small group ministry team member – assists the small group ministry in developing and coaching leaders and starting new groups Small group leader or member

ARE YOU WILLING TO WELCOME THE STRANGER (GUEST) AMONG US THIS CHRISTMAS SEASON?

We look around and believe we are a welcoming congregation, but there is a difference between welcoming and really connecting with someone. People are not necessarily looking for a friendly church but rather for a friend (per a recent webinar) – someone to share life with and navigate a world that is increasingly more complex and hostile to the Christian faith. So if we are just friendly, give a quick greeting to someone but then are immediately looking for one of our friends to catch up with – that can be incredibly discouraging for someone visiting and

feeling lost within our midst. It also might explain why statistics say only 10% of guests return!

As Brenda has highlighted, we have been working on formulating a Connecting Ministries Team, but that team will only be effective if the entire congregation is committed to welcoming others and helping them connect into our congregation. Realistically, what would this look like?

First – making sure we have enough greeters at the outside doors. Why is this important? Can you remember back to when you first entered our complex (and it is complicated!)? With our multiple levels and doors it can be difficult for a visitor to find the sanctuary, childcare/children's ministry, restrooms, etc. Just having a warm greeting lets them know they have at least successfully found a door to enter! Questioning if they need help finding something also alleviates them looking uncomfortable or getting up the courage to ask someone for help. This ministry position is ideal for someone who likes helping others and maybe is not comfortable with having to converse for any length of time. For those attending the first service, you are already in the building, so it is an excellent opportunity to help serve those at the second service. If this interests you, contact Meaghan Cady, Beth Dean, or Janet Cook.

Second – having eyes for people who are new in our midst, including them in conversations, really connecting with them. FORM is an easy acronym that was shared with me recently to help people connect :

F amily – O ccupation –	are they from here? Do they have kids? Etc? their work, being a mom or dad, retired – all of this is a big part of people's identity
Recreation – Message –	what do they like to do for fun? tell them why you love being involved here at FPC:Endicott and ask if they would like some additional information or to be introduced to someone in a particular ministry. Encourage them to fill out a connect card (located in the pews) so we have ways to follow up with them.

You can always use the information you learned about them to purposefully introduce them to someone who may have the same interests, be in the same stage of life or just might be someone you feel they will connect with. You don't have to connect with others by yourself! Just be willing to take that first step and get to know someone.

This Advent season, may our church truly be a place for others to find their home. I would hate for someone to leave our doors feeling like there was "no place for them in the inn."


