# A Note from the Pastors



### **December 2, 2018**

On the first Sunday of Advent, we light the candle of Hope.



The money designated for TOF will be split in half, but capped at \$7,500 for the Mission trip. Any undesignated gifts will be divided equally between the local and global causes.

Session finalized and approved a revised Sexual Conduct Policy/Safe Sanctuary Policy. Personnel Committee will decide the rollout of this policy for the church and will have copies of the policy available for the congregation.

As we rush toward Christmas and all the chaos/desires that our society encourages, I would like to encourage each and every one of us to reflect on the greatest gift we have been given- the gift of Christ and HE is more than enough! I ran across an article\* that reflected on how we have developed such a "fear of missing out" (FOMO) that we forget to be present in the moment:

- Social media channels such as Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter personify FOMO
- •JOMO (the joy of missing out) is the emotionally intelligent antidote to FOMO and is essentially about being present and being content with where you are in life
- •Instead of constantly trying to keep up with the Joneses, JOMO allows us to be who we are in the present moment, which is the secret to finding happiness
- •Instead of having FOMO over silly experiences on social media, we should be wary about having FO-MO over missing moments with loved ones, watching sunsets, laughing at jokes, traveling, walking barefoot through the grass, hearing the sound of the ocean, and enjoying good food with family and friends

This December, join us as we explore "The Gifts of Christmas" and share those gifts with family, friends, and those who are seeking the true meaning of Christmas. I pray we all will develop a healthy "fear of missing out" when we are not present in worship, when we are not at our small group, when we do not share our faith, when we miss an opportunity to serve those in Christian love, etc. And in so doing, we develop the joy of missing out on things that do not have eternal value but distract us from the Joy of our Salvation.
