


We had so many reactions to this note:

just the light of our windows as she looks from the outside in?

Looking at the postcard, we realized that the picture shows the original sanctuary, when the entrances were on Monroe Street, a bell tower rose above the main entrance, the sanctuary was decorated in dark wood, and the pews were rounded and facing a different direction.

- What made the leadership decide in the 1950's to gut and completely renovate the sanctuary, take down the bell tower, move and add windows, and change the external structure and entrances?
- How did the congregation respond?
- How did those changes help the church flourish?

DAY OF REPENTANCE | OCTOBER 6, 2019

People may be right in their own eyes, but the Lord examines their heart. — Proverbs 21:2


It happens so subtly. Passion and purpose are gradually replaced by patterns and preferences.

It happened to the church in Ephesus. They worked hard and endured hardships without growing weary. But they no longer loved God or others as they first had. So, Jesus told them through the vision He gave the Apostle John, "Repent. Anyone with ears to hear must listen to the Spirit and understand what he is saying to the churches." (Revelation 2:2-5, 7)

It happened to the church in Laodicea. They had become lukewarm in their passion, neither hot nor cold. Their tepid indifference was intolerable to Jesus. He told them through the vision He gave the Apostle John, "Repent. Anyone with ears to hear must listen to the Spirit and understand what he is saying to the churches." (Revelation 3:15-16, 22)

It has happened in FPC: Endicott. We also have lost our first love and have become lukewarm about fulfilling our primary purpose. God is using the voice of Paul Borden to help us recognize that, individually and as a congregation collectively, we have failed to make disciples for Jesus Christ on a regular and consistent basis.

Therefore, one of the prescriptions we have been given is to join together in a Day of Repentance:



"On a Sunday in the Fall of 2019, the pastors will call the congregation to a united worship service to allow the congregation to seek forgiveness for failing to make new disciples for Jesus Christ. The pastors, staff, and elders will offer prayers that day, asking God to forgive them individually and as a congregation collectively for failing to make disciples for Jesus Christ on a regular and consistent basis. The leaders will pray that God will give this congregation a passion for people apart from God and a compelling vision to do all they can to rectify this situation. Following this service of prayer, the congregation will be divided into groups to prayer walk and prayer drive in our communities to pray for those apart from God. Then, everyone will return to the church for a common meal, to share what God taught them as they prayed, and to celebrate the sacrament of communion together.

Sunday, October 6, is our Day of Repentance. May we have the integrity to look at where we have fallen short, the humility to confess our disobedience, and the courage to move forward in greater obedience to the Great Commission.

Prove by the way you live that you have repented of your sins and turned to God. Matthew 3:8, NLT

Leadership Community

Elders spent a long time at the July Session meeting discussing the CTC process, the prescriptions we were given, the impact on the congregation, the commitment that will be required from each elder and each staff member, and our ultimate desire to follow Christ. Elders prayed together and approved going forward with the CTC Process/Prescriptions. They dealt with the

recommendations that program staff offered regarding next steps in fulfilling the prescriptions.

At the August Session meeting, Tom Parker, CTC Coach, from Phoenix, Arizona was introduced, via phone call, to the elders. A "holy coincidence" - Tom was born and baptized at FPC:E as a small child. His parents (Charles and Phyllis Parker) attended our church before relocating when Tom was 10. He has been trained by ECO and assigned as our "coach." Tom will interact with the pastors every 2-4 weeks in the beginning and then monthly for one year. Tom emphasized the importance of the elders working on being healthy disciples and be constant in prayer. He led the Session in prayer for our church and our leaders.

Elders committed to pray Romans 1:16 at 1:16pm each day: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile"

Elders hosted CTC Gatherings during the summer to maintain communication with the congregation.

Elders are reading the book "Deep & Wide" by Andy Stanley and discussing the content at their meetings.

Elders have committed to meet in the Chapel each Sunday, starting September 8, from 8:45-9:05am to pray for the worship, teaching, children's ministry, etc. Everyone is welcome!

Business

Session approved Wendy Howard to work up to 10 hours/ week in the front office during the summer construction.

Session approved Sharon Early and JD Paff as our Commissioners to the 2020 ECO National Gathering.

Session approved Jean Jenkins as Elder Commissioner at the 9/27/19 Cornerstone Presbytery meeting.

Session responded to two
Covenant Partners who have
decided to find other places to
worship. Both people were
placed on the inactive list until
they are ready to ask for a Letter
of Transfer. The Session prayed
for these people and blessed
them in their decisions.

Discipleship

June 5 Meeting – In light of celebrating two weddings this summer in their family, Elder Bruce Barney led a devotion from the book "God's Little Devotion Book for Couples." He read three readings- one for a newer couple, one for a middle -age couple, and one for an older couple. Bruce included Ephesians 5:31, Ecclesiastes 9:9, and Hosea 2:19 in his exhortation for us to live out this important commitment.

July 10 Meeting - Elder Chris Galli led a devotion titled "Don't Follow Your Emotions, Follow God!" He read Jeremiah 17:9 "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it." Modern media encourages us to "follow your heart, and it is hard to ignore the power of our feelings, but we DO have control over them. God advises us to be mindful of what our heart tells us. No one can MAKE you angry; no one can MAKE you love them; no one can MAKE you worry, and no one can MAKE you happy. Chris encouraged us to guard our hearts and submit our feelings to the truth of God's Word.

<u>September 4 Meeting</u> – Elder Jean Jenkins read an excerpt from Brother Andrew's book, *And God Changed His Mind*, which exhorts us to pray for the salvation of others.

So join us as we move closer to our destination of being a church that works daily towards being and spreading the Good News of the Gospel.






Please join us in welcoming our nursery school's new Director of Business...
