Discussion Questions:

Adapt and ask these questions to fit your children's ages and developmental levels.

- 1. Were the Israelites growing or shrinking in numbers? How did Pharaoh feel about that?
- 2. What did Pharaoh order the people to do with all Jewish baby boys?
- 3. Who found Moses in the basket on the river? What did she do?
- 4. How did Moses end up in the wilderness as a shepherd?
- 5. What crazy thing did Moses see? Who spoke to him and what did he say?
- 6. Who does God say He is? What does that mean?

Craft:

SUPPLIES

Paper, red/yellow/orange tissue paper or construction paper, glue/tape, leaves, crayons

CREATE

Have your children go outside and find some leaves to create their own bush. Have them glue or tape their leaves to their paper. Then have them tape or glue the fire colored paper around the bush. Next, your children can color or draw around the bush. They can write "I AM" or draw Moses. Talk with your children about how powerful God is and remind them of the promise He gave Moses - "I will be with you." God wants to be with us too!
